SIX COLLEAGUES ATTENDED THE FIRST IFSSH MID-TERM COURSE

Six colleagues from Xian and Shandong Provinces traveled across the globe to 1st IFSSH Mid-term Course held January 31 - February 3, 2024 organized by Ecuadorian Society of Hand Surgery (ECUMANO) in Quito, Ecuador. A total of 493 colleagues from 25 countries.

The new Quito Metropolitan Convention Centre was a perfect venue, set 2850 meters above sea level in a valley surrounded by the Andes. The IFSSH-sponsored keynote speakers Don Lalonde, Amy Moore, Andrea Atzei, Marc Garcia Elias, and Chaitanya Mudgal, provided masterclass lectures on 5 major fields: Biomechanics and basic Sciences, Arthroscopy, Nerve and Microsurgery, Fractures and Osteosynthesis, and WALANT.

The course party was held in Mitad del Mundo on equator, with great food and splendid dance with local people. Dr Xiaoju Zheng from Xian and Dr Chao Chen from Jinan served as invited speakers.

The Mid-term Course is a major event of IFSSH. The second will be held 3 years later in Europe.





Colleagues Attended The 67th JSSH Joy and Relaxation Congress in Nara

 ${\sf A}$ large team of colleagues from Yangzhou, Xian, Nantong and Shandong Provinces traveled to Nara to attend the 67th Congress of Japanese Society for Surgery of the Hand (JSSH) held April 25 - 26, 2024. A total of 1900 colleagues from Japan and other countries attended the congress.

The congress chair is Professor Sheohei Omokawa of Nara Medical University. The team of Yangzhou led by Dr Jiaxian Gu, that of Xian led by Dr Xiaoju Zhen and that of Jinan led by Dr Zeng Tao Wang made 10 oral presentations. Dr Zeng Tao Wang delivered 60 minutes lunch session lecture on microsurgical digital reconstruction. Dr Kevin Chung delivered invited lecture (60 min) on clinical research methods and Dr Jin Bo Tang delivered invited lecture (60 min) on 10 hypotheses in hand surgery.

The presidential dinner was held in historic Nara Hotel and welcome party was a buffer dinner in the congress venue. This is the first time that a large team of colleagues from mainland China attended JSSH congress.

Before the JSSH, Dr Zhen Tao Wang and other colleagues visited Kono Company in Tokyo city and Chiba Prefecture.





NEWS IN BRIEF:

ACU (with principle recipients: Jing Chen and Qianqian Yang) obtained an IFSSH grant in May 2024 under the title of "Regional workshops in Western China" for traveling to 3 cities to organize seminars and workshops for one week.

With the increasingly important roles and unparalleled efficiency of online education and information exchange in the recent decade, the website has been the largest and most comprehensive in Chinese language in this profession and plays an important role in educating many colleagues across the mainland China. Many colleagues perhaps consider it a website made and own by a big team, but, in fact it is majorly out of personal efforts which aim to establish a platform for many colleagues, especially those who seek different opinions of treating difficult or particular cases, sharing experience of surgical techniques, and exchanging information about academic conferences and courses.

The efforts of Dr Wang are extraordinary, as this is a website largely funded by himself for helping those who need education. This website has served as an important tool and platform of education and professional development, and has regularly attracted thousands of viewers and visitors. Some of currently active and prominent hand surgeons grew up with the help of this website. The website houses a large number of online posts of cases and related discussion, technical communications, and notice of professional events, such as international and domestic congresses, courses, cadaveric dissection and journal clubs.

It is hard to imagine Dr Wang has maintained this website through his own momentary contribution, time, and the continuing efforts of assembling a team to maintain quality of this website (likely he need to pay webmaster's salary). Without external research fund for the website, as a true lover of surgery and with a big heart of helping patients, Dr Wang and his team managed to maintain this website since 1998 with themselves' money and time.
